Tour Days 15-16 31 March & 1 April 2019 Hegang Coal Railway 31 March

Initial impressions were that the mine railway was very quiet. Some of this can be put down to our arrival on a Sunday. On Monday, there was more action but it was still quiet compared to my previous 2007 visit in steam days.
