

March 2020 Update

Corona Virus CORVID-19

It would be difficult to write this update without mentioning the corona virus. At the moment, it is not affecting any of the trips planned apart from making me cautious and it means I will wait as long as practically possible before deciding to go ahead with any trips. That still leaves several months to confirm Romania in August and China in September and I am not thinking of cancelling these trips at the moment.

Germany

My one week in the Harz at Wernigerode passed off smoothly even if it was a bit wet and windy. Notable features were the Brocken closed at times by high winds and falling trees, the re-wilding of much of the commercial pine forests which were once a feature of the lineside, a steam-heat diesel Harz Kamel with one carriage and crew van substituting for a missing railbus and sufficient steam locos to operate all the steam turns with 99 6001 in use from Gernrode, 99 222 and the more modern standards being the other locos in use.

China Narrow Gauge III 8 September - 5 October

I am still expecting the China Narrow Gauge III tour to travel from Dalian to Chengdu in September visiting a good variety of narrow gauge salt, iron ore, reed, limestone, coal and tourist steam lines. I'm expecting to have updates on the lines from Jun in May and hope to be able to confirm that the tour will go ahead in the May-June period.

I've received some news from Japanese enthusiast Ichiro Junpu who writes:

Matian: It seems that operations resumed on Feb.9th.

But the road is blocked for infection control, so it is difficult to move along the railway now.

No announcement has been made yet regarding closure.

Yujian: I still don't know if it will start in May as planned. My friend has planned to go there for Japanese September holidays (from Sep.19th to 22th), so maybe I can see you at Dengfeng.

Laohekou: Laohekou Cement from Zhengzhou.

It became convenient because a high-speed rail going from Zhengzhou to Dengzhou opened in last Dec.

(Llimestone mine is about 45km from Dengzhoudong Station)
